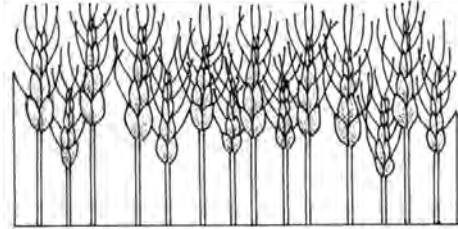
CHURCH ETIQUETTE

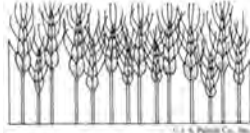
