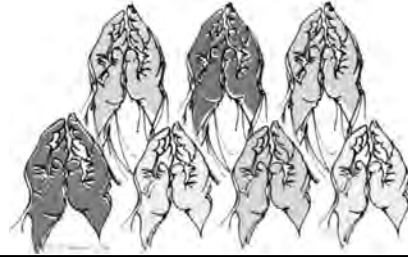
CHURCH ETIQUETTE

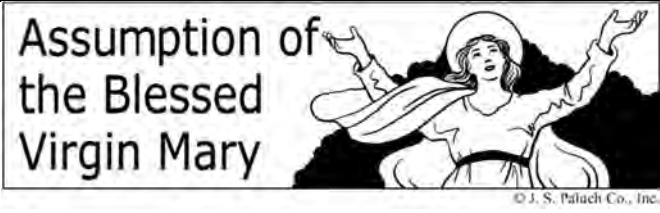

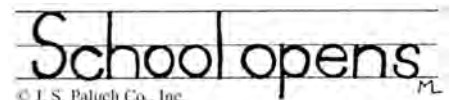

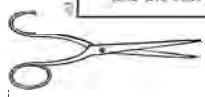
