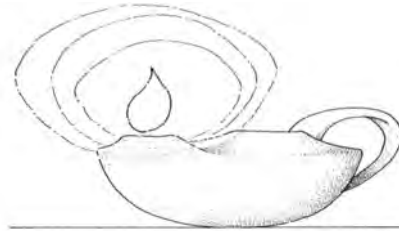
CHURCH ETIQUETTE

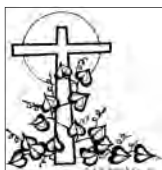



EXERCISE CLASSES FOR SENIORS

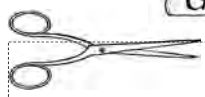
