

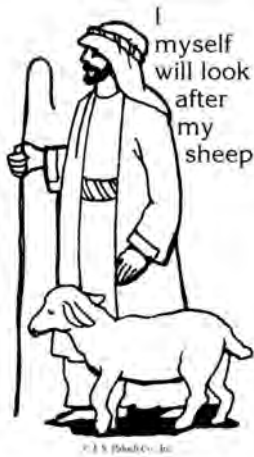


BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD

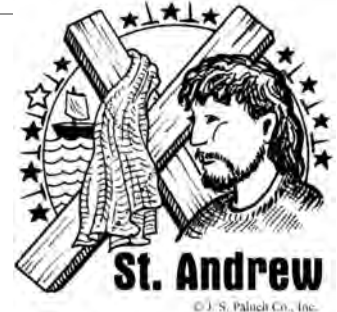

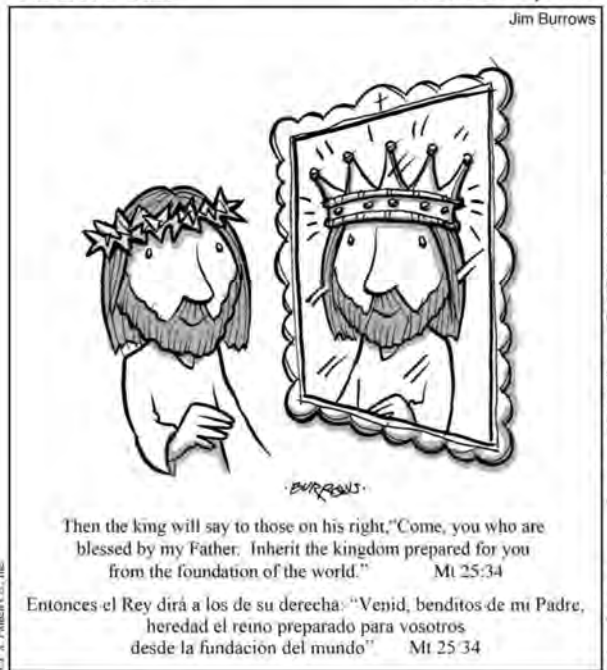
